WHAT IS THIS TRAINEESHIP ABOUT?

CPC30508 - Certificate III in Dogging is designed to enable persons desiring to work in the construction industry as doggers to meet minimum national competency standards in relation to associated general construction dogging activities.

To obtain this qualification you will require:

- ❖ all (11) core units of competency
- ❖ four elective units (one elective may be substituted from a relevant endorsed Training Package)

Traineeship Pathways

Persons who are employed either full time or on a permanent part-time basis for a minimum of 20 hours per week can apply for this traineeship.

Available Funding

Funding is available under either the state based User Choice program, the federally funded 'Existing Worker' program or the Productivity Places Program. Employers can enrol new employees who have been employed for not more than 3 months under User Choice. Employees who have been employed for more than 3 months are classified as 'existing workers'.



Recognition of Prior Learning and Mutual Recognition

Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL) is also available to all trainees. RPL recognises skills and competency developed through work and life experiences. In addition to RPL, Australian Training Management Pty Ltd recognises the AQF Qualifications and/ or Statements of Attainment issued by any other Registered Training Organisation.

FEES AND CHARGES

For the agreed fee trainees will receive up to 12 half day on-site contact visits from our trainers and assessors over the term of their traineeship. This will be combined into 6 full day on-site contact visits for regional clients. Additional fees and charges apply where a trainee requires additional contact time with our trainer due to individual learner needs, a lack of on-the-job learning opportunities, or on-site delays on the day of the scheduled visits. A cancellation fee equal to the full daily fee applies to scheduled contact visits unless a cancellation is made not less than 10 working days prior to the scheduled site visit. All kilometres travelled outside the metropolitan area will be charged at the prevailing rate. Travel time outside the metropolitan area will be charged. Accommodation charges will be applied as required.
