# Rigging (Intermediate Level)

## HIGH RISK LICENSE

Course Code ATM020

### AIM OF THE COURSE / TARGET GROUP

This course provides participants with the required skills and knowledge to enable them to safely and conduct rigging in a variety of situations in compliance with Work Safe WA Standards and Regulations. The course is aligned to the nationally recognised unit **CPCCLRG3002A License to Perform Rigging Intermediate Level** which specifies the outcomes required to undertake basic rigging work, both in sight and out of sight of the crane operator, for the purpose of shifting loads mechanically and includes selecting sling types and sizes and maintaining the stability of the load. This course is suitable for anyone requiring to sling or shift loads within the workplace.

### DURATION

3 days + *Please note: Pre-course reading is essential to enable course completion within 3 day timeframe. Additional training can be provided if needed (post course delivery)*

### COURSE CONTENT

The program addresses the following:

- Licensing, Regulations and Duty of Care
- Personal Safety and Effective Workplace Communication
- Plant and Equipment Inspection
- Conduct the Risk Assessment Process and Manage Risk
- Installation of Hoist / Master Climber / Platforms / Safety Nets / Arrest Systems
- Ropes, Bends, Hitches, Whipping and Splicing
- Erection of structural steel and pre-cast panels
- Work Safely with others

### ASSESSMENT METHOD

Knowledge based questionnaires and practical demonstration

### PRE-REQUISITE FOR THIS COURSE

Important note

Must have basic English literacy skills, be **over 18 years of age** and already have held the Dogging and Basic Rigging Licenses for a minimum of 6 months; with demonstrated industry experience. Pre-course reading is essential.

### ACADEMIC AWARD AND RECOGNITION

Upon successful completion participants will be issued with the following Statement of Attainment which will be recognised nationally:

- CPCCLRG3002A - License to Perform Rigging Intermediate Level

### WHAT TO WEAR

All course participants are required to wear appropriate work attire. Whilst closed in shoes are a minimum requirement for attendance on any course, steel capped safety boots are required for forklift, dogging, vehicle loading crane (hiab) and rigging courses.

### MORNING TEA AND LUNCH

Feel free to grab a tea or coffee before the course starts and during the course breaks. All participants will be offered morning/ afternoon tea and for those attending full day courses **lunch is provided** (an assortment of sandwiches and hot finger foods). Persons with special dietary requirements should cater for their personal needs.
